G.11.a Partial Property Tax Exemption for Certain Persons 65 Years of Age or Older Resolution WHEREAS, Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law authorizes taxing municipalities, including school districts, after a public hearing, to adopt a resolution exempting real property owned by certain qualified persons sixty-five (65) years of age or over to the extent of fifty per centum of the assessed valuation thereof, and

WHEREAS, Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law allows school districts to adopt a sliding scale income level provision for property owned by certain qualified persons sixty-five (65) years of age of over to the extent of fifty per centum of the assessed valuation thereof, and

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Catskill Central School District Board of Education grants an exemption to eligible persons in accordance with the sliding income schedule hereinafter set forth, said exemption to be subject to the income and all other provisions of Section 467 of the Real Property Tax Law:
