Catskill Central School District is proposing a Capital Improvement Project to enhance our facilities for **21st Century learning and address** health & safety and infrastructure needs throughout the district. The project seeks to bring needed improvements to the District's buildings, academic programs, classrooms, security controls, roadways, parking lots, and athletic fields through renovations, construction, and equipment purchases. Doing this work as a capital project makes it eligible for 69.5% NYS Building Aid (state building aid is not available for work completed outside of a capital project).

The vote will be taking place on Tuesday, February 12th from 1:00PM to 9:00PM in the Middle School Gym.


