<u>NYS Assessment Information and</u> <u>Operation Opt-In Workshop</u>

In a few weeks, New York State assessments in ELA, Math, and Science will be upon us. The schedule for state assessments is as follows:

- ELA (Grades 6-8): Tuesday, April 2nd and Wednesday, April 3rd
- Math (Grades 6-8): Wednesday, May 1st and Thursday, May 2nd
- Science (Grade 8): Monday, June 3rd

Last year we had an overall participation rate of \sim 97%. This was a huge accomplishment!

Data received from the assessments allow our teachers and administrators to examine how CMS students are performing compared with their peers from across the state. It gives us a tool to ensure that our teaching methods are truly effective.

In addition, participation in the assessments gives your child practice taking a standardized test so that they are confidently prepared for their High School Regents test-taking experiences.

Every student's participation in the assessments makes a difference in helping us reach our goal of providing our students with the best education!

On Tuesday, March 19th at 5:30 PM, (before the Future Freshmen presentation) the Middle School will be hosting an Opt-In workshop in the MS auditorium to provide further information about the assessments and answer any questions you might have.

PBIS: Tips for Success: Be Responsible— Throughout the School!

Do you get to school on time? Do you always have your homework ready? If you do, you may be a responsible student.

Not everyone knows that responsibility extends outside of the classroom too! Only **you** are responsible for your education, and you can take some easy steps to be more responsible in the classrooms, hallways, and even the bathrooms! Here's what responsibility looks like in these spaces:

- Speak quietly in common areas, especially during lunchtime transitions. Students are still in classrooms and are working hard and learning. Too much noise can be distracting.
 - Be mindful of your bathroom schedule. Are you taking breaks during the same classes every day? Try to space out breaks throughout the day.
- Sign out when you leave the classroom, even if its just to get a drink of water or go to your locker.
- If you see someone doing something dangerous or irresponsible, let your teacher, a hall monitor, or another adult know what is going on immediately.
- You have three minutes to transition between classes. Use that time wisely to stop at your locker, fill up a water bottle and/or sign up for after school activities.
- Arrive to each class on time. Be in your seat and ready to learn before the bell rings!

Being **RESPONSIBLE** means that we do the right thing even when no one is looking. We do the right thing just because it is right and not because we will get credit or praise for doing it.
