The assessments provide our staff with valuable information that allows us to ensure that our students get the best education possible. Below are some facts about the assessments.

- Like the 2018 tests, the 2019 ELA and Math Assessments are two sessions each.
- Tests are untimed.
- Test questions are reviewed and written by NYS Teachers.

- Assessment data allows our teachers and administrators to examine how CMS students are performing compared with their peers from across the state.
- Assessment data gives us a tool to ensure that our teaching methods are truly effective.
- Participation in the assessments gives your child practice taking a standardized test, so that they are confidently prepared for the High School Regents test-taking experiences.
- The 2019 Score Reports for parents will feature more information about what students should know and be able to do at each grade level.


