Collectively, New York's 37 BOCES launched an online conversation regarding how community members feel about returning to school in the fall or whenever it is possible.








- Thoughts were gathered from more than 60,000 participants. More than 80,000 thoughts were shared, resulting in more than 2.2 million ratings.

Statewide Themes

- Top Themes based upon number of Thoughts
 - In-person Instruction important I think getting back to in-person schooling is very important and we need to figure out a way to make this happen safely and as quickly as possible.
 - Remote Instruction pros and cons Not all kids benefit from viewing things online, they require more interactive learning
 - Cleaning/Disinfecting All classrooms should have cleaning products, tissues and hand sanitizers.
 - Socialization/Mental Health Physical health and mental health must be taking into consideration equally.
 - Safety/Social Distancing I'm concerned about the health and safety of the students and teachers.

- Top Themes based upon number of Thoughts
 - Social Distancing (60 Thoughts)
 - Safety (34 Thoughts)
 - Remote Instruction pros and cons (33 Thoughts)
 - Cleaning/Disinfecting (31 Thoughts)
 - In-person instruction important (31 Thoughts)
- Top Themes based upon Ratings
 - Cleaning/Disinfecting
 - Budget/Funding
 - Safety
 - Schools as support systems
 - Sick Students/Staff Response



Top Thoughts Questar III

- Schools will need additional funding not less (4.6/5)
- Schools need to disinfect daily (4.5/5)
- Teachers will need more support, not less (4.5/5)
- Schools should NOT prioritize attendance over health (4.4/5)
- How are our kids going to be? Will they be afraid? Will they need more emotional support initially and how will we provide that (4.3/5)
- Families with special needs children need face to face services (4.3/5)



Top Thoughts - based upon services received.

□ SPED -

- If virtual learning continues services need to be provided with frequency as written on IEP— condensed services are causing regression of skills.
- The students and teachers need to see each other in person That personal connection is very important.

□ ENL −

- "At-Risk" populations are not getting the services they need.
- Adequate supervision not present during the day school provide structure and safety.



Top Thoughts based upon grade level

Elementary –

- Deep cleaning everyday Sanitizer dispensers in every room.
- Digital format can not replicate in person learning.

Middle

- Please reopen schools in the fall!
- Remote learning is not a substitute for in person education It
 may work as a supplement or to assist, it is not a substitute.

High

- Any child showing symptoms should be sent home immediately to avoid the spread of illness/Covid-19
- Not all students thrive in the distance learning environment Not all families are able to provide the level of support required.
