BUDGET GOALS

- Create a budget that grows programs, maintains appropriate levels of staffing and continue to offer a quality instructional program to students who have various educational needs.
- Ensure the estimates in the proposed budget includes estimates of appropriations based on actual needs.
- Use available information on state and local revenues and estimate expenditures
- Form estimates using conservative methods to maintain the fiscal stability of the district

BUDGET PRIORITIES

Ensure that our students have the appropriate level of teachers, support staff, social workers, guidance counselors and administrators in each building

Continue high quality professional development including focus on project based learning, technology, and special education

Continue with the current levels of extra curricular activities and sports offerings for students

Maintain our summer remediation program at our Elementary and Middle Schools.

BUDGET PRIORITIES

Maintain our Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten programs at CES

Maintain the same level of funding for books, supplies, materials and reduce the amount spent on technology equipment that is in the 2020-21 school budgets for our schools.

Continue to subscribe to the CTE program offerings at Questar III BOCES, Tech Valley, Bard Early College, and the Bridge Program.

- Significant increase in Foundation Aid

- Universal Pre-K: Additional allocation for full-day special aid fund
- No change to STAR
- Inclusion of significant Federal Aid CRRSA & America Rescue
 Plan Act special aid fund paid over several years 9/2024
- Services Aid Proposal NOT implemented

- Federal Aid further info to be released on April 30th
- CRRSA 90% ESSER + Base Allocation = \$1,402,213, based on Title I student from 2020 count, ends 9/30/2023
- American Rescue Plan Act = \$3,611,623, based on Title I student from 2020 count, ends 9/30/24
- Total NEW Federal Funds = \$5,013,836

DR. COOK'S BUDGET RECOMMENDATIONS

- Reduction-In-Force of (1) Special Education Teacher position through attrition (retirement).
- Include Recommended Staff Additions
- Increase the tax levy by 2.87% (\$20,142,997)
- Use available Fund Balance (\$2,500,000) to close the budget gap.
- Maximize the use of the Federal American Recovery funding to bridge the gaps from the learning loss experienced during the pandemic, socialemotional support, wireless connectivity and programming.
- Ensure the District continues to make fiscally responsible decisions in analyzing the need to replace staff who resign or retire from the District.
