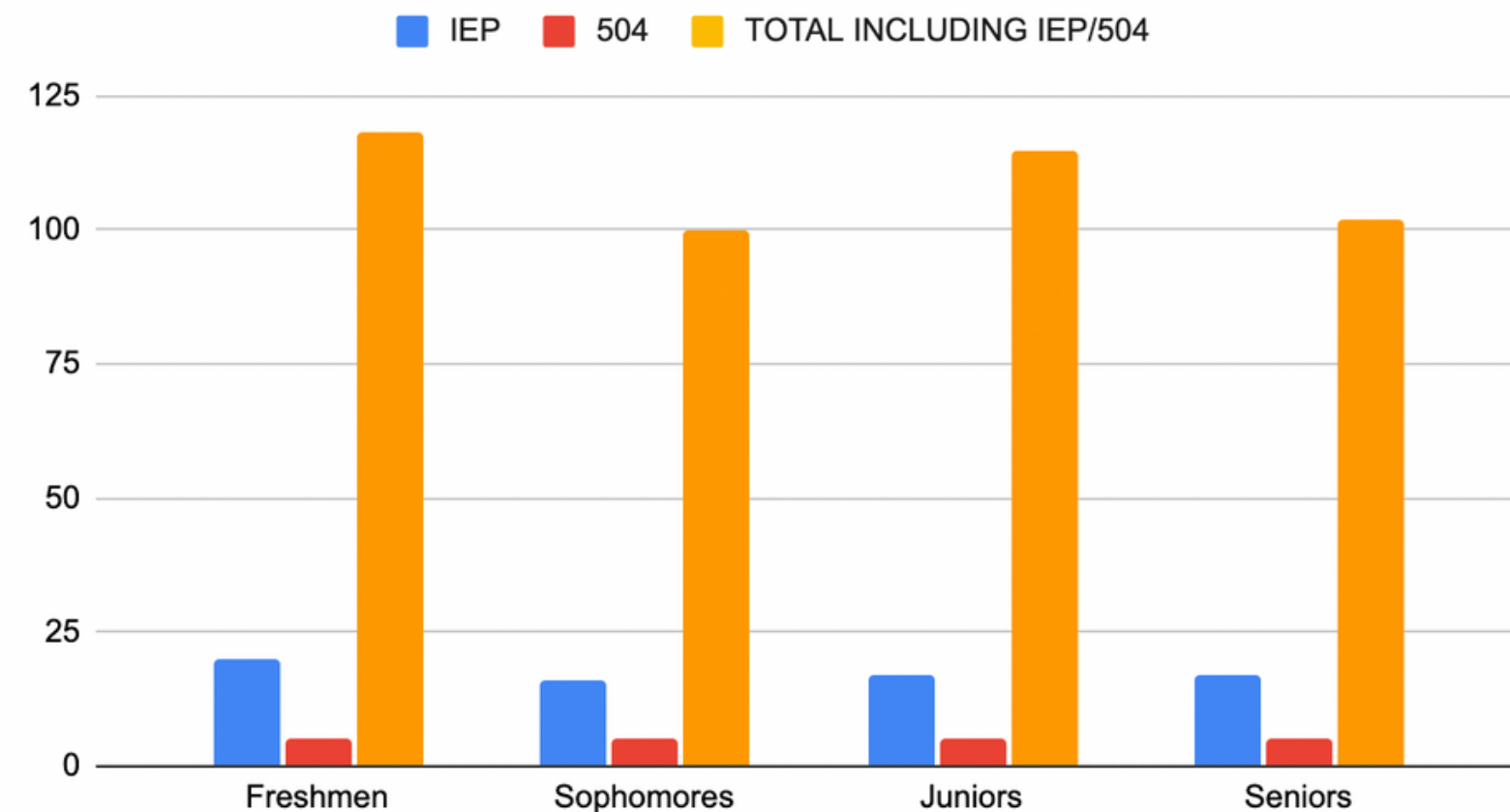

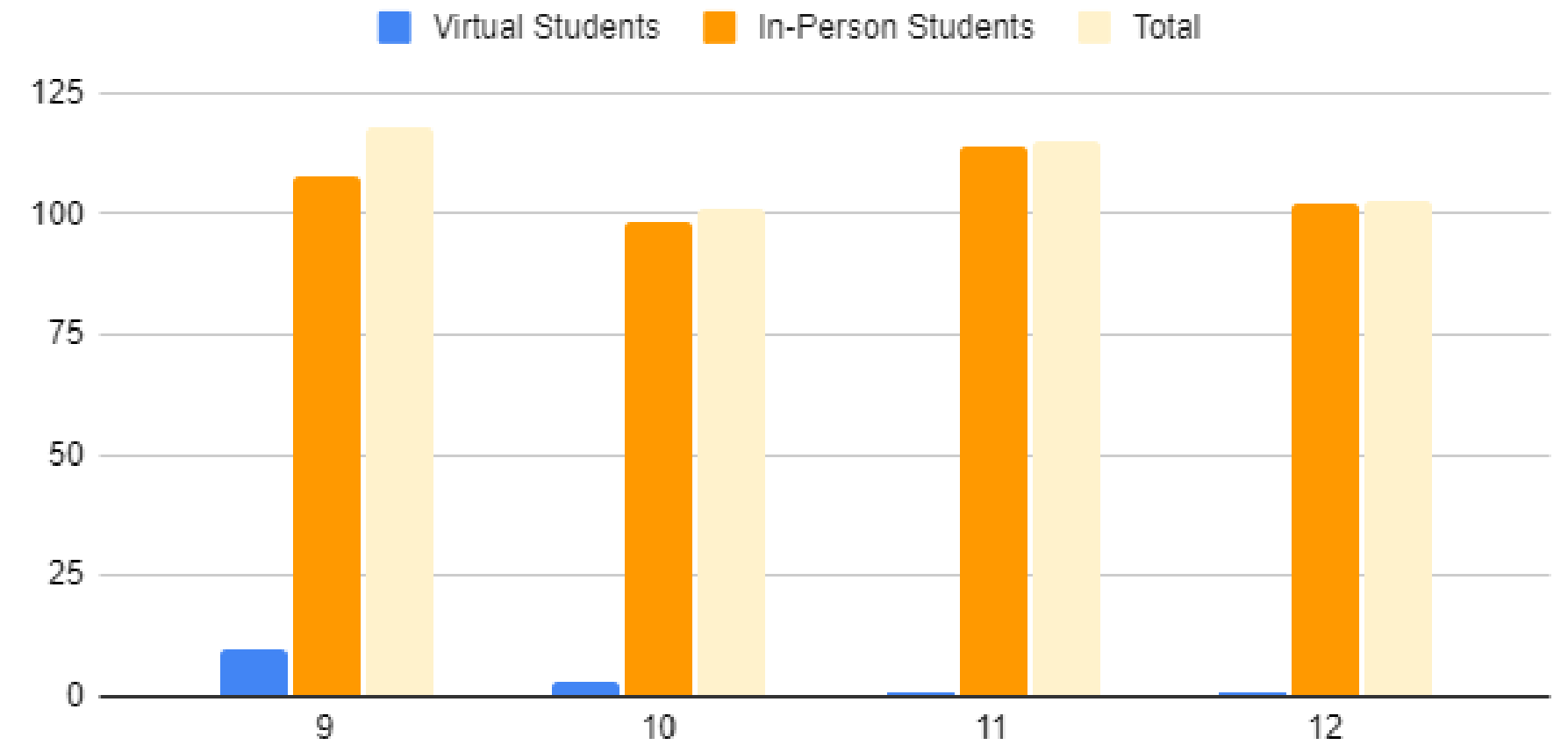

- Special Education numbers will be added after Annual Reviews have been completed





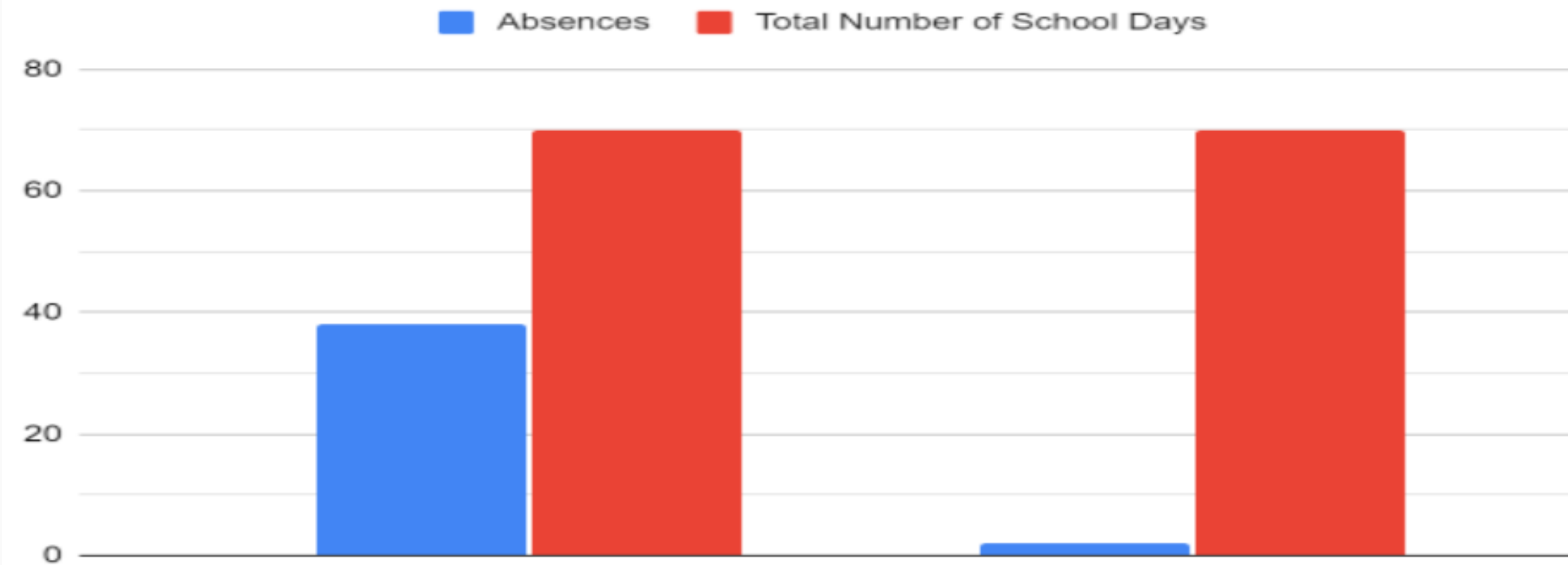
# ATTENDANCE

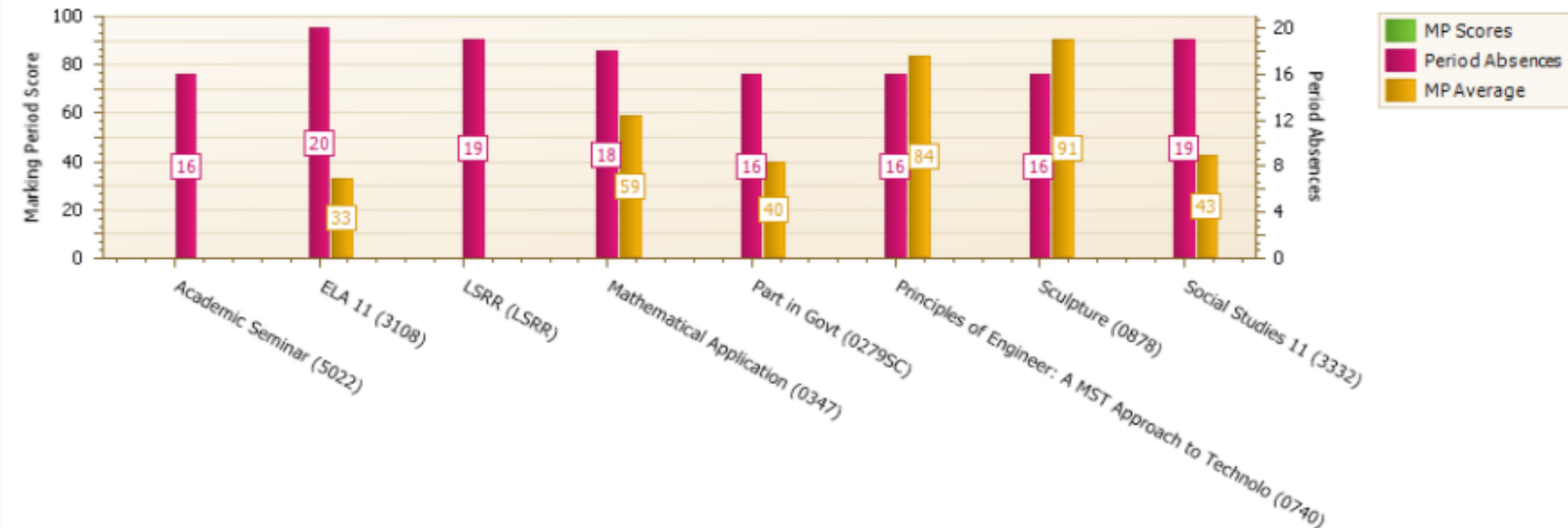
- Students who accumulate 5 lates/absences, 10 lates/absences, 20 lates/absences and 30 lates/absences

Sculpture II has been added to the course catalog for next year. We are tentatively looking at offering the Cultures class through DL.

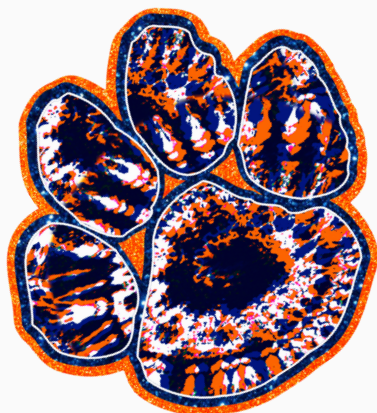
## PBIS

Ms. Storrs and her students have been working tirelessly to prepare for Tarzan

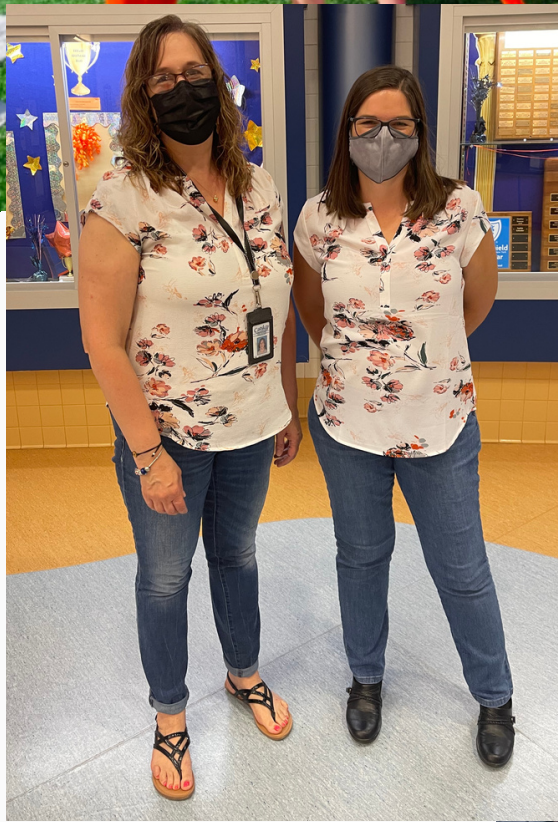


## Clubs and Activities
