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NYS Assessment Information

In a few weeks, New York State assessments in ELA, Math, and Science will be beginning. The schedule for state assessments is as follows:

- ELA (Grades 6-8): Tuesday, March 29th and Wednesday, March 30th.
- Math (Grades 6-8): Wednesday, April 27th and Thursday, April 28th.
- Science (Grade 8): Monday, June 6th

These assessments provide our staff with valuable information that allows us to ensure that our students get the best education possible. This information is even more important as we continue to identify and fill the educational gaps the last two years have brought.

So why should all of our students participate?

- Assessment data allows our teachers and administrators to examine how CMS students are performing compared with their peers from across the state.
- Assessment data gives us a tool to ensure that our teaching methods are truly effective.
- Participation in the assessments gives your child practice taking a standardized test, so that they are confidently prepared for the High School Regents test-taking experiences.

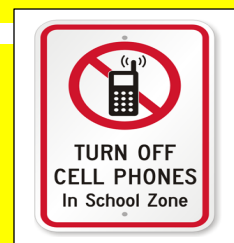


Important Information about Cell Phone use at CMS

Mobile devices create a social, intellectual, and emotional barrier to being fully present during school and can cause disruption to the educational process, particularly at CMS.

To reduce unnecessary distraction, the display and/or use by students of mobile devices is prohibited from the start of the school day until the end of the regular school day.

This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, the use of mobile devices in classrooms, library, common areas, restrooms, and includes transition times between classes, and recess. Students may use their cell phone during their lunch period while in the cafeteria.
